Relating Training Interventions in Aviation to Your World

Dave Kaiser is Vice President and Chief Learning Officer for Crew Training International (CTI). Dave holds a Master's Degree specializing in Aviation Education Technology and Aviation Safety Systems/Human Factors from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University. He also possesses a Bachelor of Science Degree in Applied Physics from Montclair State University. Dave is a retired US Navy Commander with over 23 years of aviation experience as both a Commercial and Navy Aviator. He has extensive experience in aviation training to include Instructional System Design, Adult Learning, Advanced Learning Technologies, Generational Learning and Blended Learning.



In his presentation, Dave discussed the top human factor deficiencies that can affect everyone from pilots to business professionals. These deficiencies are:

- Channelized Attention
- Task Mis-prioritization
- Selecting an Inappropriate Course of Action
- Poor Crew Coordination

To overcome these human factor errors, specifically in the military, Dave and his team conducted a three-year research study specifically focusing on Air Force students. Over this three-year period, they tracked over 540 Air Force pilots and sensor operators using Kirkpatrick's levels of learning. The team measured levels 1, 2, and 3 of Kirkpatrick's learning theory.

Dave described the four training interventions. The study began with Enhanced Academics. This immersed the employees into interactive multi-media to vicariously experience an actual aircraft mishap. Second, the students were given web-based interactive case histories that gave them real-life scenarios to help them understand the implications of each of the human factor deficiencies. The third step in the study was a Game-Based Multi-Task Trainer and the final step was a Serious Gaming Team Trainer. The serious gaming platform forced the students into a high-stress and competitive environment where they had to successfully

apply the skills they learned in the Enhanced Academic portion of the course.

- Level 1 saw the highest of all level of interventions achieved
- Level 2 was achieved and significant learning was found in all skills
- Level 3 did not see a significant difference, but there were positive trends. There were reductions in negative behaviors.
