Ann Turner emphasized the importance of community, of work, and of family in order to succeed in life.

Keys:

- 1. Role models and mentors
- Continue to learn
- 3. Take risks, such as public speaking. Learn to deal with rejection and failure.
- 4. Take family time
- 5. Work efficiently
- Look forward to going to work:
 - If you look forward to going to work 80% of the time, that's good. You are probably in the right spot.
 - 60% --time to make changes in the job
 - 40%--explore other opportunities
 - 20%--serious trouble
- 7. Take time to play
- 8. Do community service
- 9. Be true to yourself
- 10. Keep a sense of humor. Be around people who are optimistic, humorous, and enjoy laughing.
- Evaluate what is important to you, what you do well, and what you enjoy.
- Write down your interests without considering the barriers, such as education, experience, skills, etc.
- Consider what new skills you would need to develop.
- Create a plan of action for developing these skills.
- Network, network and network.
